Served on various committees in the County and SC Bar Associations as well as the American Bar Association. Founder and first president of the Charleston County Senior Lawyers, and of the SC Bar Senior Lawyers. Served as Secretary and member of the Council of the Special Courts Conference of the Judicial Division of ABA; Represented the Conference in the ABA House of Delegates for two terms. Served two terms on the ABA Senior Lawyers Division Council in addition to working on various committees. Elected Vice Chair of the SLD in 2003. Currently serving as Chair Elect of SLD.
